The Trophy awarded to the third place chapter in the Stevenson Division competition is sponsored by the SCMS. The Society also sponsors the "S. Alden Pendelton Award for Excellence in the Community Service Program of the IMA." In addition, the Society provides judges for the selection of the recipients of the Stuart Cameron and Margaret McLeod Scholarships.

SCMS is also known as the "Society for Continuing Membership Service." This describes your fellow chapter members who are active members of the STUART CAMERON McLEOD SOCIETY.

As of June 30, 2000 there was a total of 1,100 regular and Emeritus Life members of the Society.
